CAMPBELLSVILLE UNIVERSITY STATEMENT ON SEXUAL ASSAULT

Campbellsville University will not tolerate any form of sexual assault, also including acquaintance rape. If there is probable cause to believe that a sexual assault of any form has occurred by a student, faculty, or staff member, this university will actively pursue disciplinary action through its own means and/ or through subject to prosecution under the law. This university is committed to maintaining a safe atmosphere for higher learning without the fear from intimidation, exploitation, deviate sexual behavior, or sexual assault of any nature.

Definitions of sexual offenses

Sexual Misconduct / Sexual Abuse: attempting or making sexual contact with a person against his/her will **OR** with a person who is physically, mentally, or legally unable to give consent. Sexual Misconduct includes but is not limited to inappropriate touching or fondling of intimate body parts.

Sexual Assault / Rape: sexual intercourse or penetration (anal or vaginal) with another person by means of forcible compulsion, or with a person incapable of consent by reason of age and/or mental or physical incapacity. Physical/Mental incapacity includes, but is not limited to, persons who are unconscious, under the influence of drugs or alcohol, or otherwise unable to communicate consent.

Consent: the positive cooperation in an act; an attitude in accordance with a behavior; an exercise of free will. The person giving consent or permission must act freely and voluntarily **AND** have knowledge of the nature of the act involved.

Forcible Compulsion includes physical force or the threat of physical force, expressed or implied, which places a person in fear of immediate death or physical injury or kidnap of self or another person. A victim is not required to fight back. Placing a person in a continual state of fear and/or subjecting that person to an environment of emotional, verbal, or physical duress is sufficient to constitute force.

Response to an assault

1. An act of rape is a violent offence
2. Rape or a sexual assault of any form is never the victims fault
3. If an assault has occurred go to a safe place. And seek help immediately
4. The victim of an assault may be in shock or may experience a wide variety of emotions such as fear, anger disbelief and / or guilt. She/ he may seek comfort in only close friends and members of the same sex. A victim may not know whom to trust or what to do next.
5. Regardless of emotions, it is imperative to report this criminal act as soon as possible to police and campus authorities. Campbellsville University Safety and Security officers will assist victims with the necessary help needed.
6. Try to preserve all physical evidence: do not bathe, wash clothing, douche, or use any mouthwash of any kind until a medical examination has been performed by the proper medical authority.
7. Victims should consider seeking support from family members, counseling services and/ or close friends.

If you are a sexual assault victim

1. Seek help immediately.
2. Call 911
3. State your name, location and nature of the emergency.
4. Follow instructions of the authorities.

If someone else is a sexual assault victim

1. Call 911/ campus security 270-403-3611
2. Stay with the victim.
3. If the victim can be moved, take the victim to a quiet place (preferably a private office) and wait until help arrives.
4. Ask the victim if there is someone you may call (family, friend, etc.) or assist the victim in making the call.
