## **Mozart's "Cosi fan tutte" takes the stage Nov. 21-22**

The CU Opera Workshop will present Mozart's "Cosi fan tutte" on Sunday November 21 at 3:00 pm and Monday, November 22 at 8:00 pm in the Gheens Recital Hall. Admission is free and seating is first come, first serve.

"Cosi fan tutte" is a comic opera with an unusual title. Cosi means "in this way" or "like this," fan means "do," and tutte means the Italian feminine version for "all." So the title can be translated as "In this way do all (women)" or "Like this do all (women)." Or it can even be "Women are all Alike."

This comedy, reduced and sung in English, will feature both music students and faculty including soprano Juliana Moura and baritone Dr. Mark Bradley.

## **CU well represented at KMTA fall conference**

The Campbellsville University School of Music is pleased to report a strong showing at the annual fall conference of the Kentucky Music Teachers Association held last month in Louisville.

Dr. Bill Budai, Associate Professor of Music, was elected First Vice President/President-Elect for the Kentucky Music Teachers Association (KMTA) at the annual fall meeting. This is a two-year position which leads to the Presidency for the following two years. No doubt he will be outstanding in these positions and will be a fine representation of Campbellsville University during his service as an officer over the next few years.

Eunhye Lee, a current graduate student in piano pedagogy, was selected as the winner of the KMTA Bluegrass Young Artists Piano Competition and Sunghye Kim, a graduate student in flute performance, was selected for second place in the KMTA Young Artists Woodwind Competition. CU graduate student Yuri Kim won the KMTA Young Artist Piano Competition and will move on to the divisional competition in Columbus, Georgia, in January 2011.

The graduate flute quartet, Quarteto Gracioso, gave an outstanding performance, as did the group of students who played on the Chopin-Schumann tribute program.

## **Trumpet professor performs throughout state**

Dr. Reese Land, trumpet professor at Campbellsville University, has had a busy semester performing all over Kentucky.

He, along with piano professor Dr. Bill Budai, presented a public recital on September 7 at the Loretto Motherhouse. The program included works by Michael Haydn, George Antheil, Frank Campo, Joseph Turrin and Jean Baptist Arban. The same program was also performed on CU's campus on September 9.

On October 8, Dr. Land performed with the Louisville Bach Society on a performance of George Frederick Handel's oratorio *Joshua*. The performance of this large scale work was the first in the United States since the early 20th Century.

Dr. Land also performed a concert with the Kentucky Baroque Trumpets (KTB) on October 29 at the Loretto Motherhouse. This concert featured music of the Baroque era on period instruments, without the use of valves. The KBT features talented area trumpeters, many of whom are professors at prominent universities in the state.

Finally, on November 7, Dr. Land performed with the Derby City Brass Band at the Singletary Performing Arts Center in Lexington, Kentucky, on a concert of the music of Jim Curnow. This concert also featured the Cincinnati Brass Band and the Lexington Brass Band in a night of celebration of the work of this great composer.

Be sure to listen for Dr. Land on Louisville radio station WUOL Classical 90.5 FM on December 1 as he performs a lunch time concert with several other faculty from the CU School of Music. He'll also be performing with the Louisville Bach Society on December 5 at 3:00 p.m. at Calvary Episcopal Church in Louisville.
