## **Award-winning Gospel artist Larnelle Harris to present benefit concert March 25**

Five-time Grammy and 11-time Dove Award winner Larnelle Harris will be in concert on Friday, March 25 at 7:00 p.m. in the Ransdell Chapel on the campus of Campbellsville University. This concert will feature the University Orchestra and Chorale and will raise funds for the Chorale's upcoming tour of Brazil.

Admired by peers and fans alike in a career that spans over three decades,

Harris was one of the first Christian artists to cross racial barriers and build healing bridges with predominantly white churches who had never had a black singer on their platform. In addition to his Grammy and Dove Awards, including being named Male Vocalist of the Year three times by the gospel music community, Harris has garnered nineteen #1 national radio singles and countless top 10 hits. Songs such as "How Excellent Is Thy Name," "I Miss My Time With You," "I've Just Seen Jesus," plus many others, including his signature song, "Amen," are now considered modern gospel classics. This year, Harris was formally inducted into the prestigious Gospel Music Hall of Fame.

From the White House to the 38th Parallel, Larnelle has impacted audiences across the globe with his music. He was the first Christian artist to perform inside the Kremlin after the fall of the Soviet Union. He is one

of a handful of celebrities to receive the Ad Council's Silver Bell Award for Distinguished Public Service in recognition of his song "Mighty Spirit" as the theme song for the longest-running Public Service Announcement in television history.

Married to wife Cynthia (a.k.a. Mitzy) for over 35 years, Larnelle has successfully combined the demanding lifestyle of a global musician with being a husband and father of two grown children. Still a sought-after vocalist for special events and ceremonies, Larnelle also continues to perform solo concerts for churches and other organizations worldwide each year. His latest recording titled I WANT TO BE A STAR has already garnered three top 20 national radio singles, including the hit "Look At Your Hands" which landed in the top 3 position. Harris has appeared on several national tv shows and networks including Gaither Homecoming Specials, Live With Regis & Kathie Lee; Life Today With James Robison; CNN; Music City Tonight with Crook & Chase on TNN; 700 Club; Good Morning South Africa; Billy Graham Crusades; Hour Of Power; and Larnelle Christmas Special, among others.

World-renowned for his majestic tenor voice, one reviewer aptly declared: "Larnelle could sing the phone book and inspire you!"

**Dr. Wesley Roberts**, Professor of Music, gave organ concerts during Spring Break in southern California at St. Francis de Sales Church in Sherman Oaks, Holy Family Church in South Pasadena, and the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels in Los Angeles. He also served as organist/pianist for the 10th Anniversary Concerts of the Elizabethtown Area Sacred Community Chorus on March 5 and 6 in Elizabethtown, assisting his wife Sida, who serves as founder/director of the chorus. Following a Faculty Organ Recital in Ransdell Chapel on March 22, he will participate in the annual Bach Marathon in Lexington on March 26, performing one of the composer's choral

partitas.

**Ying-Ying Yang** (MA '06) lives in Los Angeles, has a piano studio and is pianist at her church. She married two years ago and has a seven-month old daughter. Yang recently assisted **Dr. Wesley Roberts** at an organ concert in southern California.

**Zhiwei Zheng** (MM '10) is completing her first year as a DMA in Piano Performance student at West Virginia University. She won the concerto competition on campus and is playing with the university's orchestra this month.

Matt is Principal Percussionist with the Wind

Ensemble and has a graduate assistantship in percussion. Matt's wife, **Aline Araujo Moore**, also a School of Music alum and professional violinist in the Dallas area, joined Mrs. Moore for several days of attending concerts and sightseeing. While in New York, Mrs. Moore also attended performances by the New York Philharmonic Orchestra and the New York City Ballet. Since retiring, Mrs. Moore has continued to perform organ concerts, performing in Maryland, Virginia, Mississippi, and in Kentucky. She is currently Interim Organist at Glasgow Baptist Church. Mrs. Moore is married to current Professor of Music **Dr. Jim Moore**.

**Judith Davis**, adjunct instructor of piano, recently entered two of her private students in a piano ensemble competition at the University of Tennessee at Martin. The duo won first place. Congratulations!
