Faith integration with Perry Glanzer

Campbellsville University welcomed Dr. Perry Glanzer, professor of educational foundations at Baylor University for a special day of teaching the integration of faith.

Faith Partner Spotlight Cornerstone Community Church

Cornerstone Community Church, located in the far south end of Louisville, Kentucky, is a young but growing congregation with a strong heart for its city. “Our primary focus right now is specifically the south end of Louisville,” said student minister and CU alum Trey Kissel, who co-leads the youth ministry with Isaac, a longtime member. One of their most impactful outreaches has been a unique Bible handout ministry on Dixie Highway, where volunteers distribute Bibles—complete with service information and gospel tracts—to drivers at red lights. “It’s a low-cost ministry, but it’s really cool because people who don’t know the gospel are coming to our church,” Kissel explained. Already, several families and students have joined the church through this effort. Cornerstone’s vision reaches beyond its current growth: “We want to be a church that’s known, not for how many members we have, but by how many people we send, how many people we plant, and how many people come to know who Jesus is,” Kissel said.
