



Each new student, prior to enrollment at the Campbellsville campus of Campbellsville University (CU), must complete placement testing in both English and mathematics.

The placement testing requirement applies to any new student (freshman or transfer student) who is enrolling at CU with less than 24 cumulative earned college credit hours.

In order to be exempt from this placement test requirement, a student must provide proof that demonstrates proficiency in English and mathematics prior to enrollment in courses. Students are encouraged to submit documentation showing proficiency to the enrollment office as a part of the application process.

English Proficiency:

Students may satisfy the English proficiency requirement through any one of the following methods:

- 1) Score 18 or higher on the English section of the ACT
- 2) Score 480 or higher on the Evidence Based Reading and Writing section of the revised SAT
- 3) Score 50 or higher on the CLEP College Composition examination
- 4) Score 3 or higher on the Advanced Placement (AP) English Language/Composition or English Literature/Composition examination
- 5) Score 6 or higher on the KYOTE Writing examination
- 6) Complete a college-level English composition course with a grade of “C-” or higher at CU or at another approved institution of higher learning.

Math Proficiency:

Students may satisfy the mathematics proficiency requirement through any one of the following methods:

- 1) Score 21 or higher on the mathematics section of the ACT
- 2) Score 510 or higher on the math section of the revised SAT
- 3) Score 50 or higher on the CLEP College Mathematics or College Algebra examination
- 4) Score 3 or higher on the Advanced Placement (AP) Calculus or Statistics examination
- 5) Score a 22 or higher on the KYOTE Mathematics examination
- 6) Complete a course equivalent to MTH 110, MTH 111, or MTH 130 at CU or at another approved institution of higher learning.

Students who do not meet the proficiency requirements will be required to take the Accuplacer placement test prior to enrolling in courses. The Accuplacer will be a required completion step at all New Student Orientation sessions and during all enrollment periods.
