

She told me the first day that she has ADD, and that she often just pulls worksheets from the shelves according to her mood She does not follow the school curriculum very closely but has found her own worksheets and activities that loosely follow the intended daily goals of the curriculum. This was a great system for her and worked well in her classroom, but it was not an easy system for me to learn/work with. She was also very difficult to read in terms of whether she was joking or being serious. For example, my first day in the classroom she told students "I'm going to hurt you," "come over here so I can give you a whipping," and other similar comments that took me off guard but was meant in a joking manner as part of her rapport with the students. While students were not around she would talk about them in a negative manner, pointing out ways she thought they were weird or gossiping about the parents. Similarly, she would be nice to co-workers to their face but as soon as they left she would make of them/their clothes/what they said, or generally talk negatively about them. While she was nice to me and provided me with valuable feedback for improvement, I never felt comfortable in the room because I was always worried about what she may have been saying about me behind my back.
