Scope & Purpose of Study

This study is designed to quantify the impact of the operations of Campbellsville University's Noe Education Center within the Pulaski County economy. Planned renovations and expansions of university facilities have also been studied to determine the economic impact of those investments.

In this study, economic impact is measured in terms of dollar value of total economic output, jobs, wages, and local tax revenues generated as a result of the business activities related to the operations of the Louisville Education Center.
