New Year, New Challenges

The start of the fall 2020 semester has been unique, to say the least, as the Title IX Office seeks to meet the needs of students amid the ongoing challenges presented by a global pandemic. A constant balancing act between remote/in-person work and online/in-seat coursework sparks the need for innovative responses. The Title IX Office strives to find meaningful and creative ways for engaging with the CU family.

The Title IX Office has launched an online reporting form to facilitate greater access to the Title IX process. Implementing virtual meetings via Microsoft Teams and creating secure digital documents have also helped increase operational efficiency.

I am confident that we will continue to discover inventive best practices that will not only sustain us through serving in a pandemic, but well into the future.

I've Got Your Back

A project recently launched by the Title IX office is the IGYB initiative. IGYB stands for "I've Got Your Back". Small cards with this logo on them are being distributed across campus to faculty and staff, who have been asked to place these in a visible location in their office. The back of the card contains crisis support information as well as the QR code for reporting sexual misconduct. These cards have both a symbolic and functional purpose. When students see the IGYB card, they will know that that person is someone who can help them file a report of sexual misconduct or discrimination. Additionally, they can scan the QR code on the back to file a report or call one of the crisis hotlines for assistance. The IGYB cards will also be made available in high student-traffic areas as well. This resource will be made available to main campus and regional sites by the end of the fall 2020 semester.
